## The Battlefields Trip (1)

40 Year 10s spent three days this week in Belgium and France learning about the medical advancements in World War One.

Day One saw them head to Leijsenhoek, the site of an old Casualty Clearing Station, and visiting the grave of Captain Chavasse, the only man to win 2 Victoria Crosses in World War One, before heading to Ypres.

Day Two saw them head to the Somme. They went to Beaumont-Hamel, the Newfoundland memorial, and Lochnager crater, the largest man-made crater in the world.

They then went to Thiepval memorial, which houses 72,000 names of soldiers who have no known grave. It was here one of our students found the name of a very special man indeed. His name was Lt. G Cather. He won the Victoria Cross for bravery, for three times going into No Mans Land to bring 5 wounded soldiers back. One of those men was her Great-Grandfather. Without Cather, she would not have been standing here today.

They then headed back to Ypres to witness the Menin Gate ceremony.

Day Three saw them visited Langemark cemetery, the German cemetery, and visit the mass grave of 25,000 men. Then to Essex Farm to the site where the famous poem In Flanders Field was penned. It is also the site of an Advanced Dressing Station.

They finished the trip at Tyne Cot. The largest Commonwealth Cemetery. Here they held their own ceremony and laid a wreath. They shared stories of what they had learnt on the trip and held a minutes silence.

They were impeccably well behaved, and the staff thank them for how maturely they engaged with a very thought provoking trip.

Congratulations to the year 9 netball team who managed to retain their title as City champions at the U14 City netball tournament on Thursday. There were 11 schools at the tournament and the girls were unbeaten in their section; beating Littleover (who they lost to the other week in a friendly) by only 1 goal in their opening match of the tournament. They then went on to convincingly beat Woodlands 10 - 1, Noel Baker 15 - 1, Murray Park 13-0 before thrashing CODA 13-1 to go through as the winners from their section only to face Landau Forte in the semi final 5-0. Meanwhile Littleover also won their semi final so it meant the girls had to face them again in the final knowing that they were hungry for a win and wanted nothing more than to beat us.

### The 16-19 Bursary Fund

The Fund is a limited amount of money made available from the government through its funding body, the Education Funding Agency, to provide assistance to students whose access to, or completion of education is inhibited by financial constraints or barriers.

The 16-19 Bursary Fund has two elements: the 16-19 Discretionary Bursary and the 16-19 Vulnerable Student Bursary.

### **Important Message Regarding Free School Meals and Pupil Premium**

You may be aware there have been some changes to free school meal (FSM) legislation relating to income threshold for eligibility purposes and the roll out of the Universal Credit. To ensure that no pupil loses a meal as a result of these changes the Department for Education has put in place the following transitional protections:

- any claimant who is in receipt of free school meals on 31st March 2018 should continue to receive free school meals until at least summer 2023 even if their circumstances change and they would no longer meet the eligibility criteria
- any claimant who gains eligibility for free school meals from 1 April 2018 will continue to receive free school meals until at least summer 2023 even if their circumstances change and they would no longer meet the eligibility criteria

If your child <u>is not</u> currently claiming a FSM and you wish to check your eligibility please use this link <u>https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/link2ict</u> or ring the Academy and we can help you with the checking process.

If your child <u>is</u> currently claiming a FSM, because of the changes above, there is no longer a need for you to check your eligibility as your child will continue to receive a FSM until at least summer 2023 regardless of how your circumstances change.

Every application, even if you do not wish to claim the Free School Meal, could help the school secure additional funding called The Pupil Premium.

### School Transport - Service 206 to/from Chellaston Academy

You may be aware that a section of Ingleby Lane will be closed to traffic from 4th to 24th November to allow for carriageway repairs.

During this period, the school bus service will have to follow an alternative route and I regret that it will not be able to service Ingleby. Additionally, students from Stanton by Bridge will have to meet the bus at the bus shelter on the A514, Derby Road.

## Information regarding Brexit and Schools

Parents or carers of pupils who are EU, EEA or Swiss citizens that they need to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living in the UK after 2020.

- EU/EEA/Swiss Citizens and their families who are living in the UK before the UK leaves the EU can apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living in the UK after 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020.
- If individuals have been a resident in the UK for five continuous years or more, they will be eligible for settled status.
- If individuals have been a resident for less than five continuous years, they will be eligible for pre-settled status.

## **Uniform and PE Kit**

Further to our announcement in June 2019 that our new PE Kit will be phased in from September 2020 we are excited to learn that the kit will be going into production next month and is on schedule to be available before the start of the next academic year, from July onwards. There is absolutely no obligation for students to have the new kit until they have outgrown what they are currently wearing and either the existing or the new kit may be worn from September in Years 8 to 11. Our incoming Year 7s will be the first full cohort to wear the kit which has house colour inserts.

The new kit consists of a choice of unisex polo shirt or V-neck female fit polo with Chellaston logo, a skirt or shorts with logo and a fully reversible, long sleeved training top. The hooped knee socks will be replaced with plain black ones.

Optional tracksuit bottoms in three different fits, with the school logo, will also be available as part of the kit, if desired.

As soon as the samples of the new kit are available, we will include photos and prices in our newsletter for reference.

We are very aware of the costs of clothing growing children and have worked very closely with the supplier to ensure that the cost is the same as the identical style kit already being sold to other schools.

If you have any existing kit which your child has already outgrown, please send it in to school and we will recycle it, making it available for students to wear later in the year if their existing kit becomes too small.

### **Health and Safety Issues**

### Sixth form Uniform Policy

At Chellaston Academy we believe that it is important for students to understand how to dress smartly and appropriately in preparation for the world of work, interviews and formal occasions. We believe that students

understand this and that the majority respond positively to fulfilling this requirement. Our dress code is therefore as follows:

### **GIRLS**

- Tailored black/grey/navy jacket/blazer.
- Black/grey/navy skirt (no shorter than two inches above the knee). No Lycra.
- Trousers or black/grey/navy tailored suit, ('skinny jeans' are not permitted). No Lycra.
- Plain black, grey or navy dress, (no shorter than two inches above the knee).
- White, black, navy or grey blouse or top (with sleeves), plain with no graphics.
- No T-Shirts.
- No footless tights/leggings
- Black shoes (no trainers or boots).
- Plain black or white belts only.

### **BOYS**

- Black blazer or black/grey/navy suit
- Black/grey/navy trousers.
- White/black shirt (tucked in).
- Black/brown shoes (no trainers).
- Sixth Form tie



### PE Kit 2019-20

The following PE kit will be required by Boys and Girls:

- •Green games shirt (with school logo)
- Black shorts
- •Black and green hooped socks
- Football boots and training shoes
- •White polo shirts (with school logo)
- White ankle socks
- •Gum shield for rugby and shin pads for football (compulsory)

A BLACK tracksuit can be worn in the winter months.
